Bloedows from Klein Silber emigrate to Canada

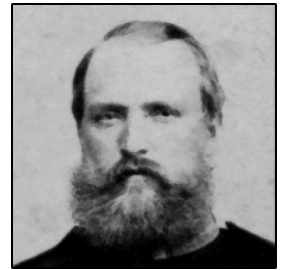


Many Bloedows from Klein Silber, Germany emigrated to Canada. The fact that many of them came from Ferdinand's home town leads one to believe that a few might have been his siblings, cousins, nieces or nephews. Likely, Ferdinand would be related to a number of them in some way or another. And some of these Canadian Bloedows then emigrated to the United States, specifically to Wisconsin.

An Audrey Bloedow (Mrs. Edmund) researched and put together a history of these Bloedows in Canada. Her 99 page history has 83 pages with names and dates, and 16 pages of the history of a Bloedow pastor in the far reaches of western Canada. This Abstract is in the collection of the Wisconsin Historical Society in Madison, Wisconsin.

**Where did Otto find official obituary and death records
on the Bloedow and Lueck families?**

According to Otto, old newspapers at the Minnesota Historical Society were one source. The Historical Society was founded by the Minnesota Territorial Government in 1849 - about 10 years before statehood. Local newspapers were required to submit copies of every paper to the Historical Society. That is why Minnesota has such an excellent collection of almost every newspaper printed in Minnesota. Otto F perused these newspapers on microfilm from the 1850s on for obituaries of the Bloedow and Lueck families.

In addition to newspaper obituaries he used death records. According to Otto, however, it wasn't until 1908 that a state law required counties to share birth and death records with the state. Some counties elected not to send their records. Brown county - home to some of Bloedow/Lueck relatives - was one of them. In these counties one has to go to the county courthouse and search for death records in large ledger books.

Today the official depository of birth and death records is the State Department of Vital Records in the Department of Health. Copies of these and earlier records are also on microfilm at the Minnesota Historical Society housed in the Minnesota History Center, St Paul, MN.

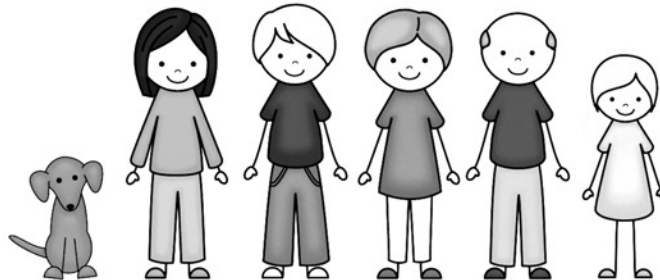
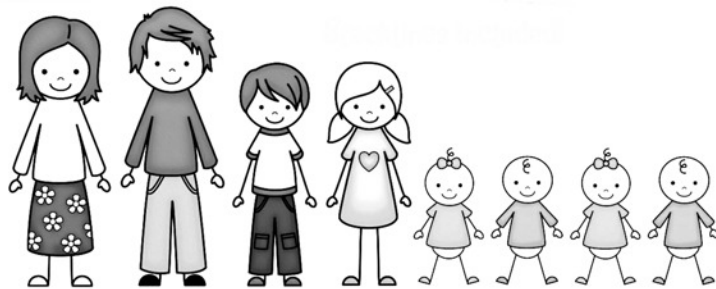

Whew! That's a lot of work.

Grandma Mary Bloedow Kuehl was the third of thirteen children. Seven were born in Brandenburg, Germany. Six were born in Minnesota: New Ulm (1), Springfield (4) and Wanda (1). Births occurred from 1866 to 1886, a twenty year period.

Four of the children died in infancy (less than a year old). Of the adults, deaths occurred from 1913 to 1973, a sixty year period. Ages at death ranged from 46 to 94.

Grandmother Mary was the only one of thirteen children to live into her nineties. She was 94. Four siblings were in their 80s.

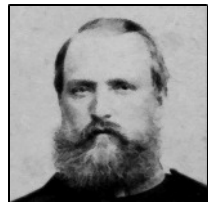

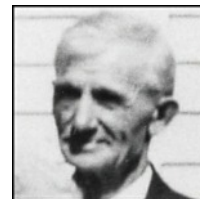

Enlarging the picture, he had been known to say that a child born in Klein Silber died in infancy.

Research Notes

Records of the deaths of infants Frank, Albert, and Emma are located in the Brown County Courthouse, New Ulm, MN. Research provided by Eva Bloedow Harder of New Ulm, granddaughter of Mary’s brother August, daughter of Ferdinand, conveyed to us by Otto F. Bloedow.

Parents and other sibling deaths are on record in the Microfilm Room of the Minnesota Historical Society which is housed in the Minnesota History Center, St Paul, MN. They are arranged by county and are organized on each reel alphabetically by surname.

Emil Bloedow - Banker

(This following information on Emil's banking career is from Phyllis' May 12, 2014 conversation with Scott Tewksbury, President Heartland State Bank, Edgeley, North Dakota.)

Emil, the youngest child of Ferdinand and Augusta Bloedow, is the only son born on the home place in Willow Lake Township, Wanda. Rather than follow in the footsteps of older brothers and become a farmer, Emil went into finance and was the successful banker and president of Security National Bank in Edgeley, North Dakota.

In 1925, at the age of 45, Emil Bloedow left First National Bank, Edgeley, ND to join with several others pooling together \$25,000 to be used as capital to obtain the charter for Security National Bank of Edgeley. Two years later, in 1927, his former employer, First National Bank in Edgeley, failed.

On the day in 1925 when Security National Bank opened its door, it was Emil who was sitting at its helm as President. At one time Emil was the second largest stockholder with 49 shares. Charlie Burgess, an Edgeley resident holding 51, with 42 being the third most held stocks by a single party.

Through the years, book upon book of hand-written records of many years of Security National history stored in the dirt floored basement were damaged. A book containing records of 1958, one of a few salvaged, contains a Statement of Condition of that year. It lists the banks footings (total assets) at 4.5 million, 465,000 capital (net worth) with deposits of a little less than four million. If the bank was doing well in 1958, one can imagine it was keeping pace with the best of them in the late sixties.

In conversation with today's president of Heartland State Bank (formerly Security National), Scott Tewksbury suggested that Emil probably never did retire, but probably worked on towards the end of his life. Through the years Emil must have managed the bank well, as forty years later Heartland State Bank continues to thrive in this small farming community.

Today Scott Tewksbury from his teenage years remembers Emil with his cigars. According to Scott's staff, in the bank one would recognize the puff, a thin line of white with Emil and his cigar at its origin. In the 1980s Security National Bank was purchased by Charlie Burgess who presided over what now became Heartland State Bank. Later Charlie's son Richard succeeded his father as president. Heartland State is a family owned bank (the only such bank) in LaMoure county, North Dakota.
